

Holy Week at First Baptist

In a matter of weeks, we will transition from Lent into Holy Week and the celebration of Easter. Holy Week is the most significant time of remembrance and celebration of the church year. In this troubling week, Jesus enters into Jerusalem, shares a meal with his friends, prays in the garden, is denied, tried and crucified. It is a reminder of the tragedy that Christ endured for all people. This is a time that we must experience anew if we are to understand the joy of Easter. Please plan to join us as we gather in worship, Palm Sunday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday.

Palm Sunday - March 25

Palm Sunday is the Christian feast that falls on the Sunday before Easter, commemorating Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. It is a joyous and special day at First Baptist, with palm processionals in both services. You are also invited to attend the Downtown Palm Sunday Service in conjunction with will meet on the front lawn at 10:20 and walk downtown together.

other downtown churches. This special service takes place in the middle of the street on Broadway! We Awakening (9:15 am) and Traditional (11:15 am) worship will meet as usual on Palm Sunday; children are invited to take part in a Palm Sunday processional at the beginning of both worship services. Children

will gather at the back of the church and be given palms, and when worship begins they parade down the aisle! Parents, please arrive a few minutes prior to worship so your children can join the fun.

Good Friday - March 30

Friday, the day the world turned dark - the day all hope turned to lament - the day of death. On Good Friday, March 30, we will gather in worship at 6 pm in the Fellowship Hall to join in the lament of those who follow Christ. It is a final moment of preparation prior to the joy of Easter.



Easter Sunday - April 1

Easter morning begins with a celebration of the Resurrection at the 9:15 am Awakening Contemporary Worship in the Fellowship Hall. Everyone is invited to enjoy pastries and beverages from 10:15 -11:15 am. Traditional Worship will celebrate the Risen Christ at 11:15 am in the Sanctuary.



Learning to Lament

What is the difference between setting your ex-boyfriend's stuff on fire in the back yard, which I talked about in my sermon Sunday, or ranting to your best friend, which Brittany McDonald Null talked about Sunday, and lamenting before God?

Lament is not just about getting things off your chest. It is not just raging or crying. It's about casting your anxieties upon God, and trusting God with them. Mere complaining indicates a lack of intimacy with God, because lament is a form of prayer. Walter Brueggemann says that undergirding biblical lament is "a relationship between the lamenter and his God that is close and deep enough for the protester to speak in imperatives, addressing God as 'you' and reminding God of God's covenantal promises." Anyone can complain, and almost everyone does. But as followers of Christ we can lament. We can talk with God about our circumstances and ask God to change things because we have a relationship with God. To lament

is to be utterly honest before God about our pain and anger. Biblical lament affirms that suffering is real and spiritually significant, but NOT hopeless. In God's mercy, God has given us a form of prayer that bends God's ear and pulls God's heart on our behalf.

Join us this Sunday as we look at Lamentations 3 and talk about hope in the midst of despair. It's still Lent, but Easter's coming! Lamentations 3 reminds us:

The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.

"The Lord is my portion," says my soul, "therefore I will hope in him."
